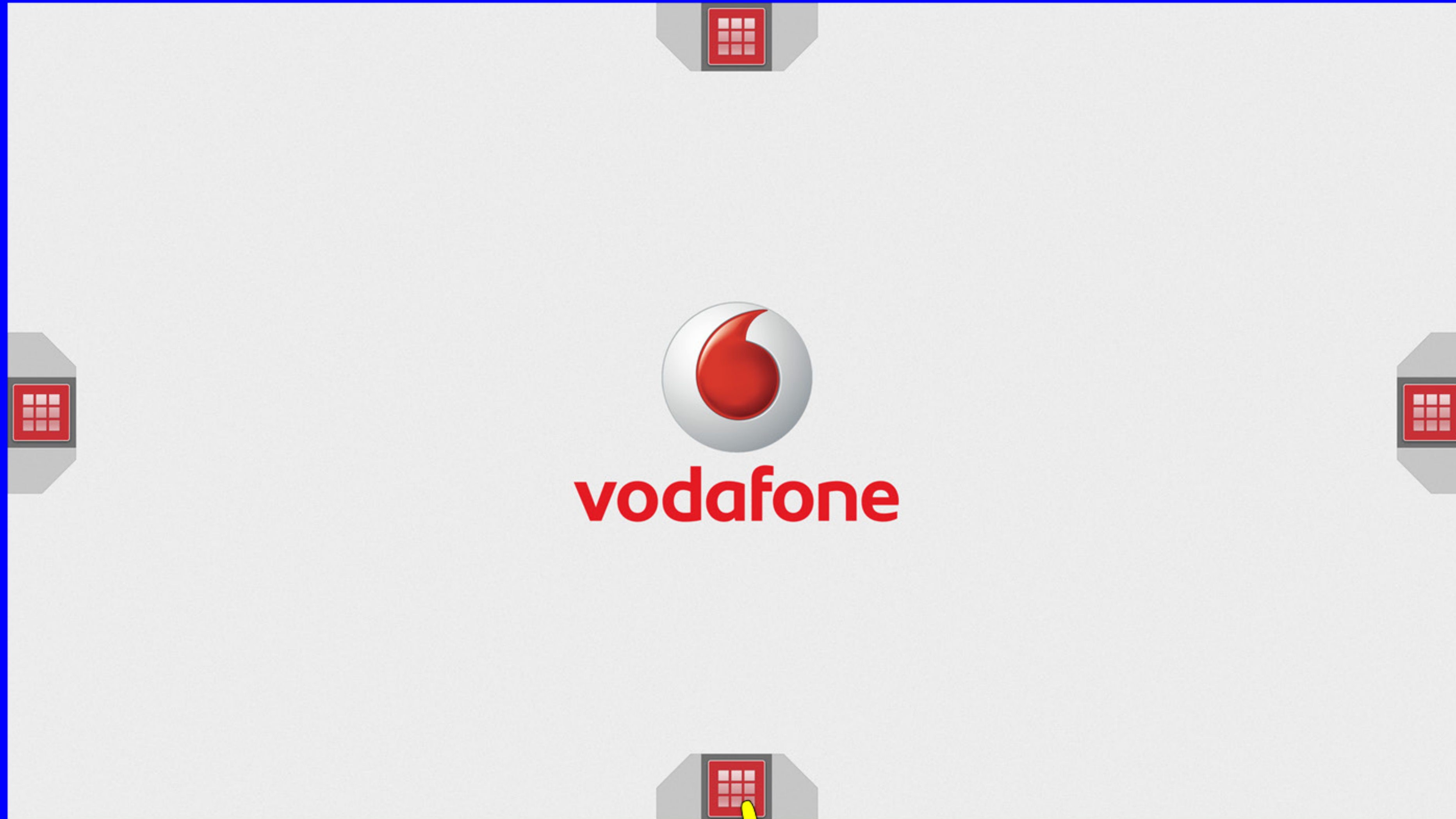
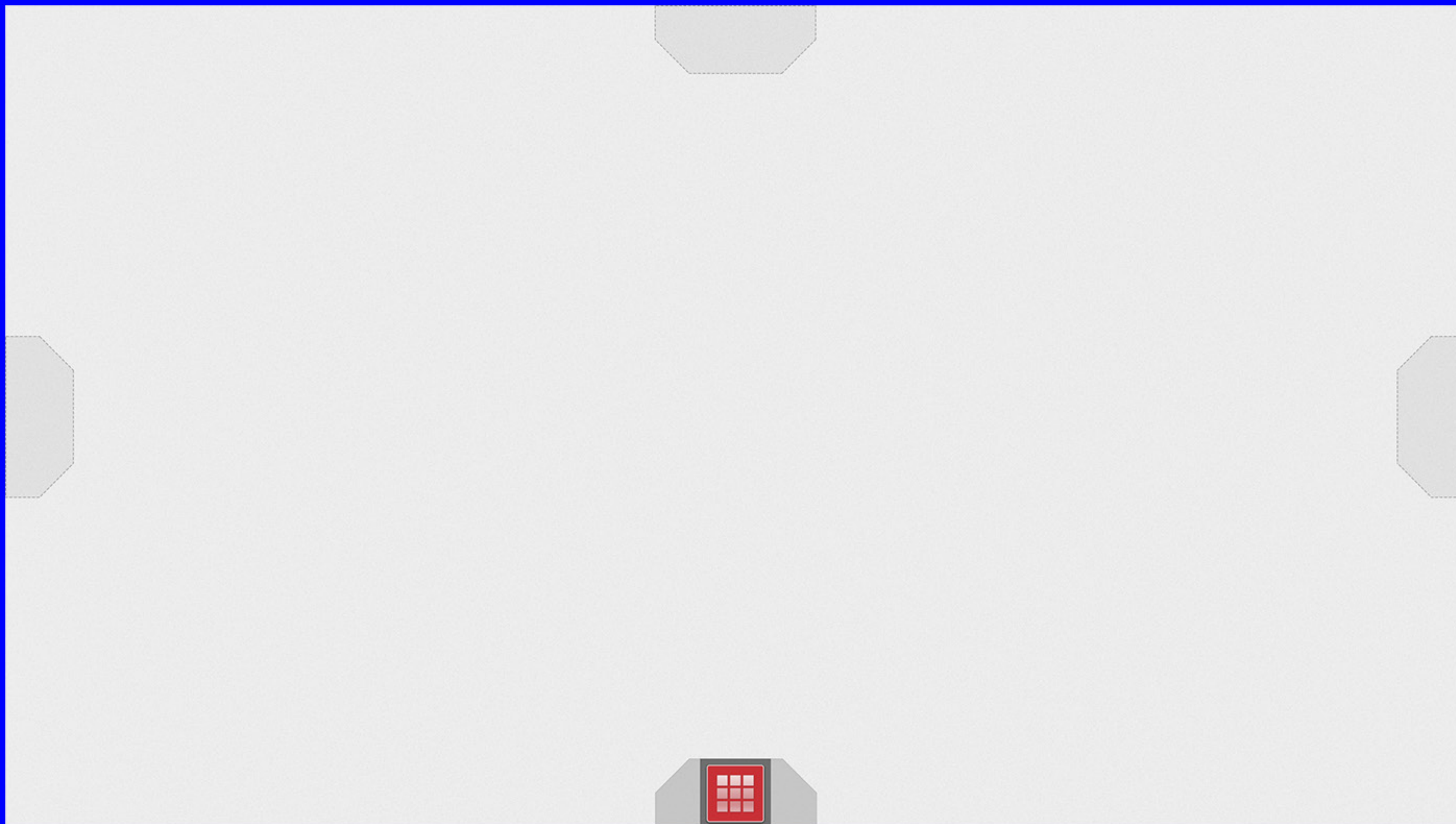


Docklets rest at the middle of all four sides.

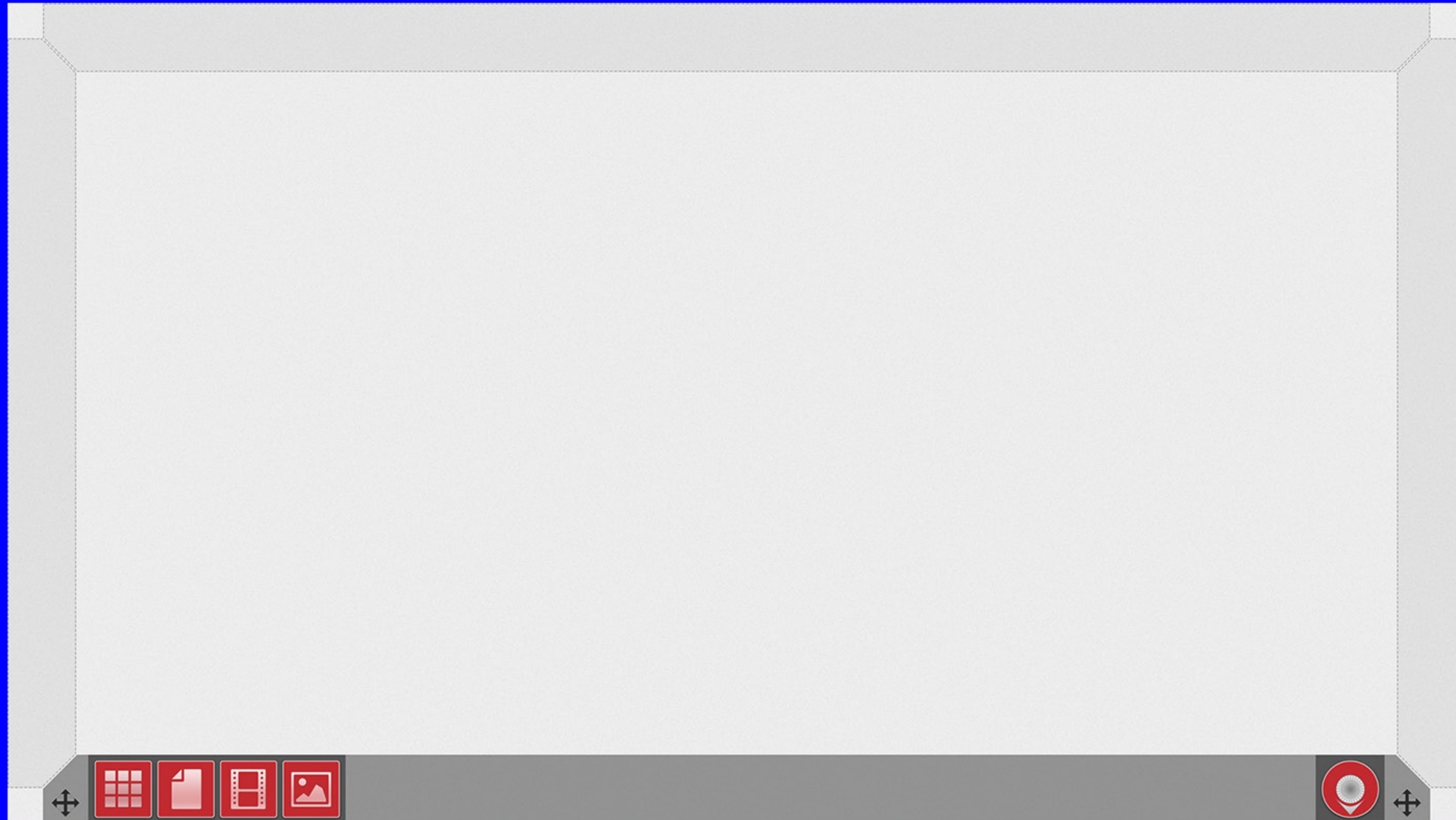
The first person in a group to touch a Docklet assumes control.



Unselected Docklets become transparent outlines.

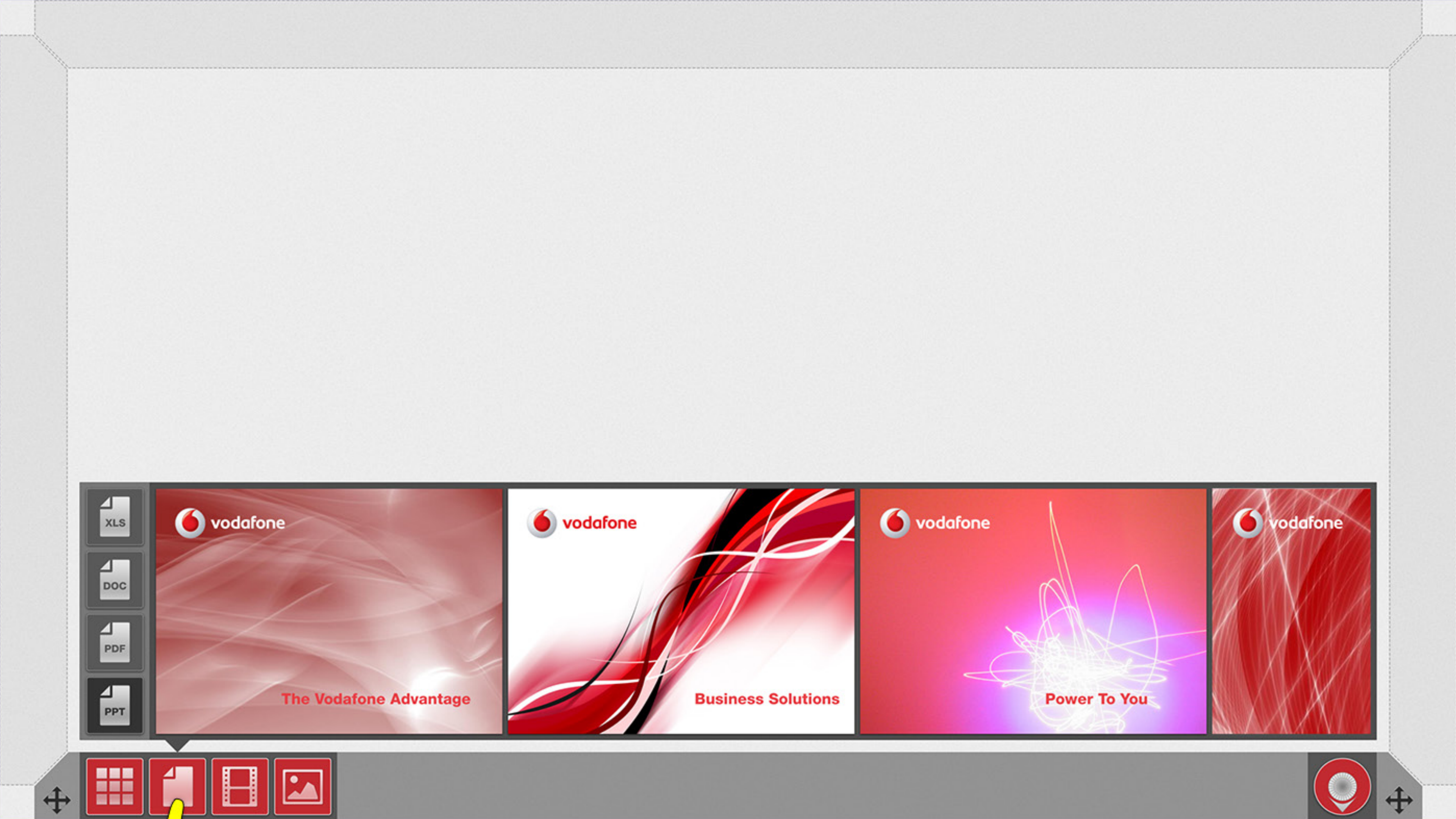


All Docketlets expand to the corners. The selected Docketlet becomes the Dock. The Main Menu is instantly available in the expanded Dock. The buttons are: System menu, Documents menu, Videos menu, Images menu. Unselected Docketlets become fully expanded Dockable Areas, allowing for an easy change of control.

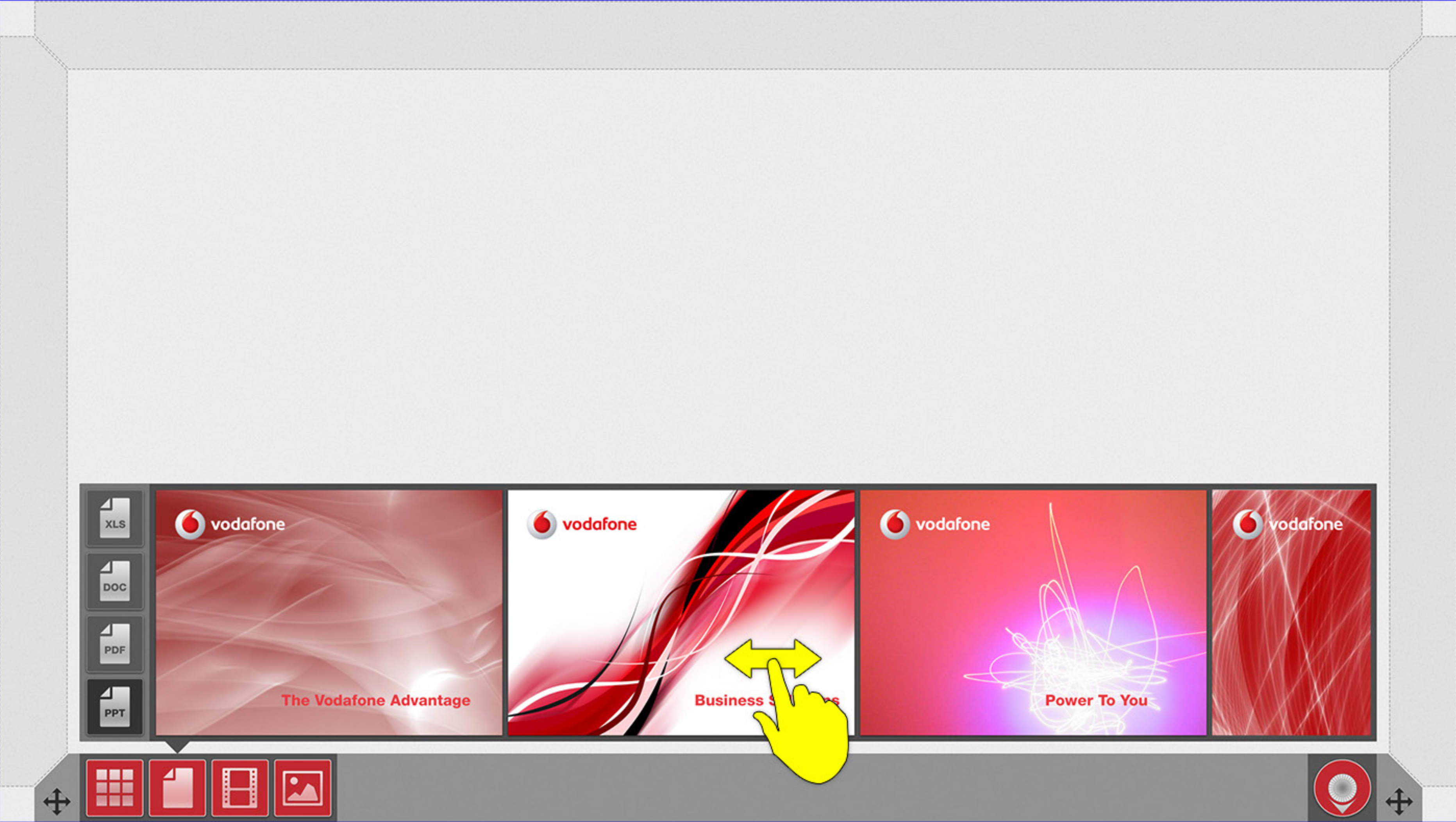


The Documents menu has a sub-menu to filter by document type.

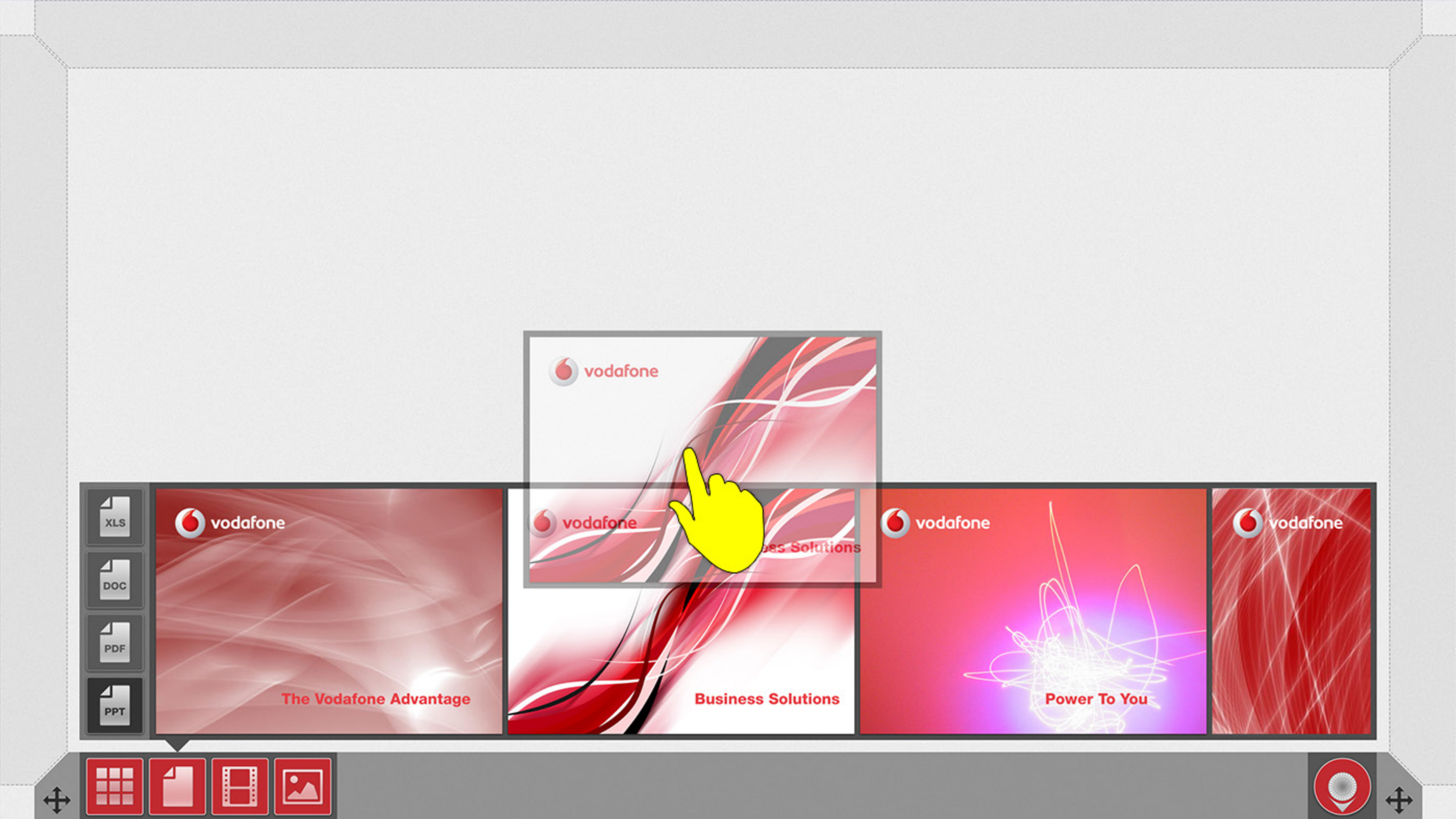
The default sub-menu selection is PPT.



The Document Slider displays documents in a preview mode and allows for easy right/left swiping gestures.



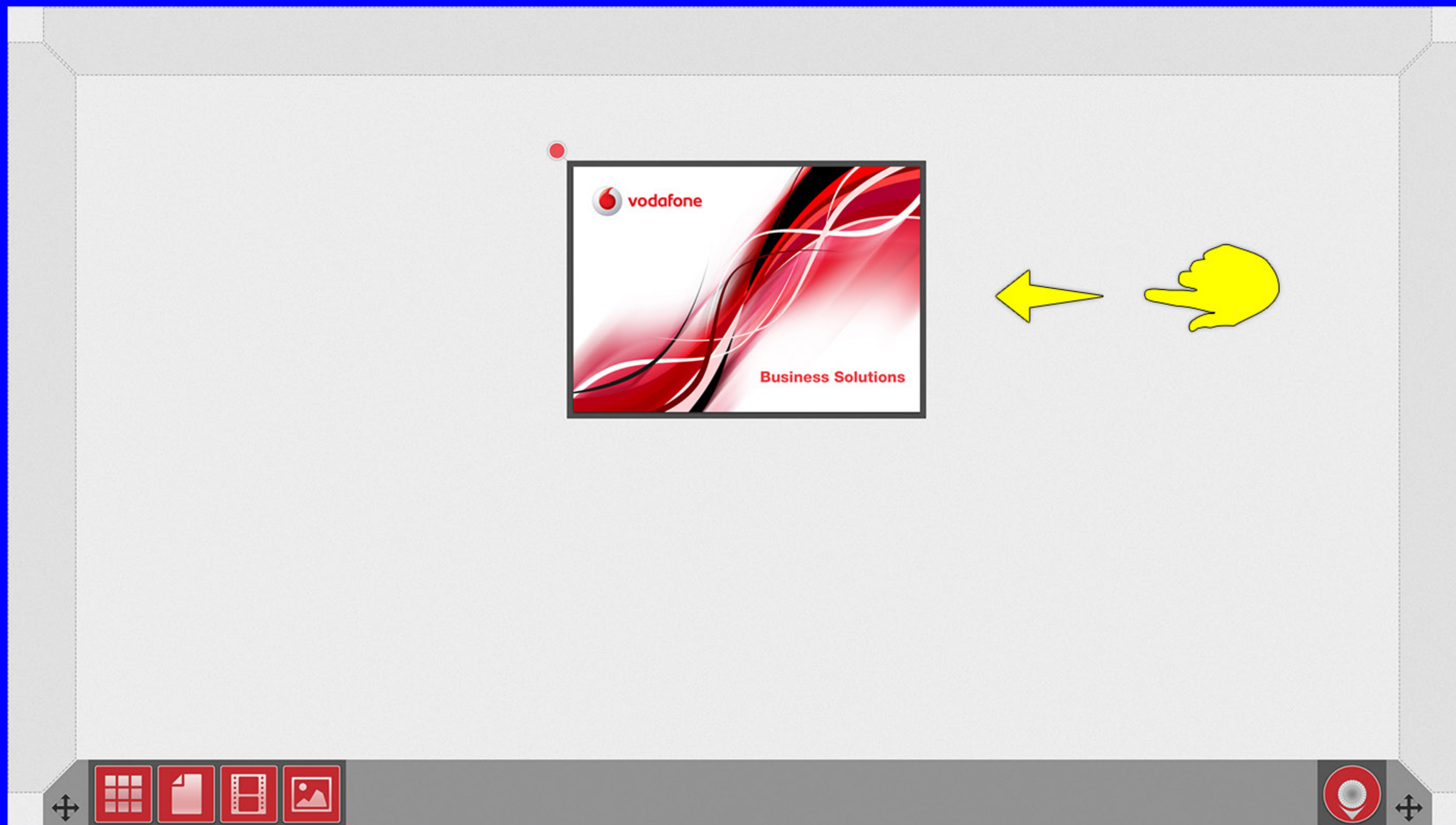
Drag a document from the Document Slider to the Canvas.



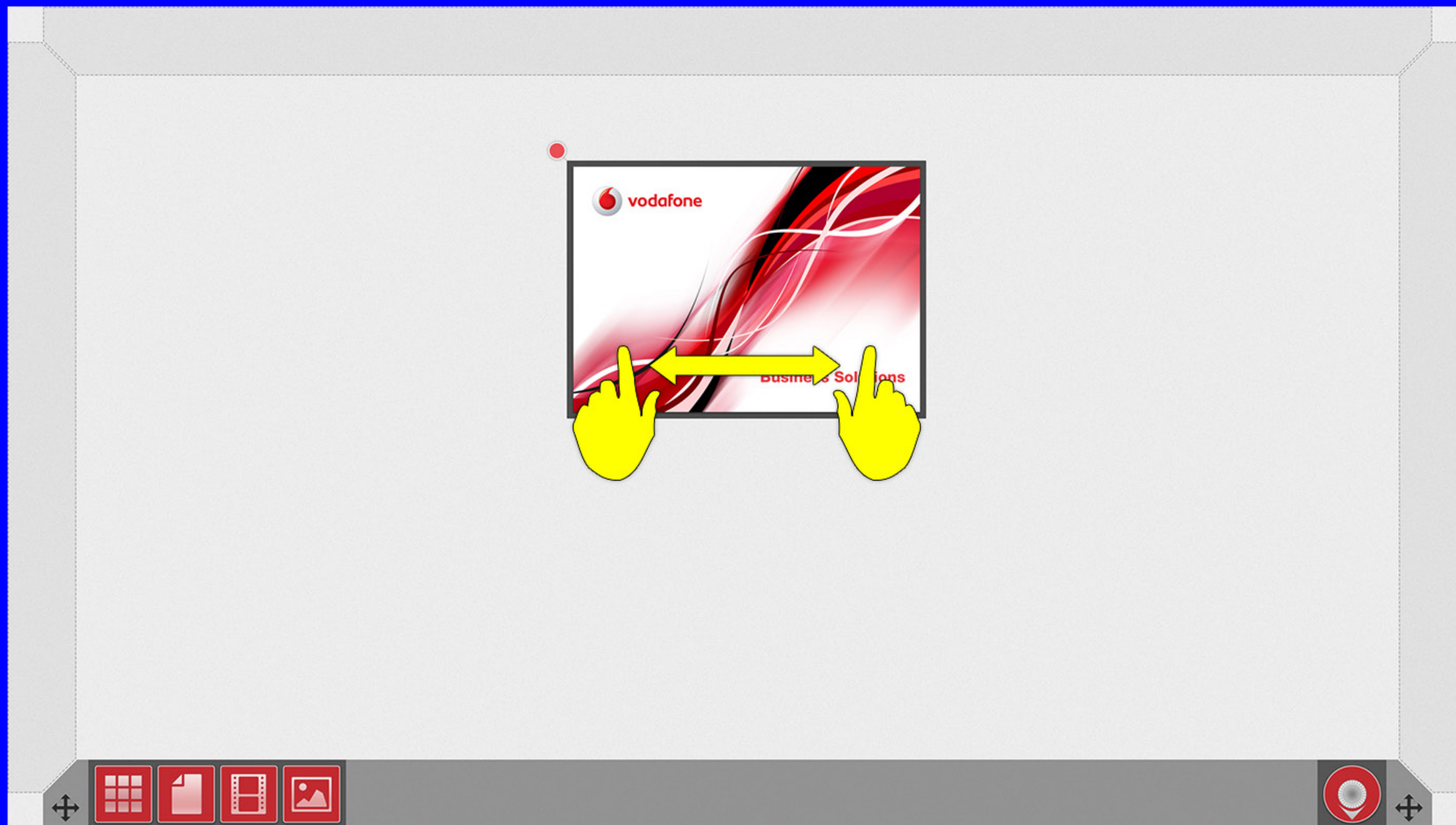
- Drop a document onto the Canvas to interact and annotate.
- A top bar containing contextual controls for the Document Slider has not yet been designed, but there will be an X button to close the Document Slider.

Familiar gestures allow users to fling, enlarge, rotate, and interact with documents on the Canvas.



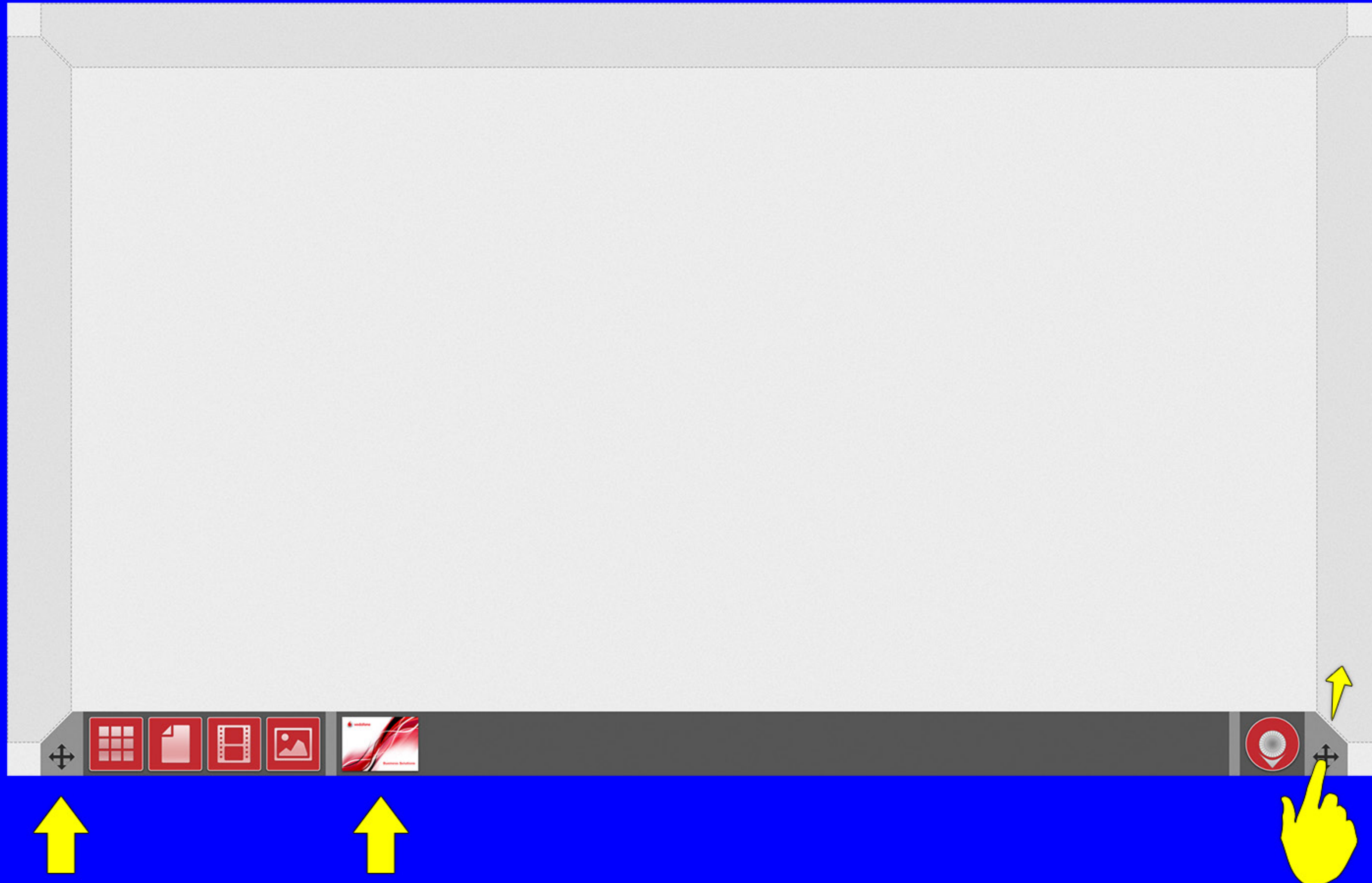
Each document has a rotation point at the top left corner and a center rotation point. If the rotation point is pressed without a finger release, the document can be rotated 360 degrees. If it is tapped once, it will reveal Edit Mode controls along the top edge of the document.



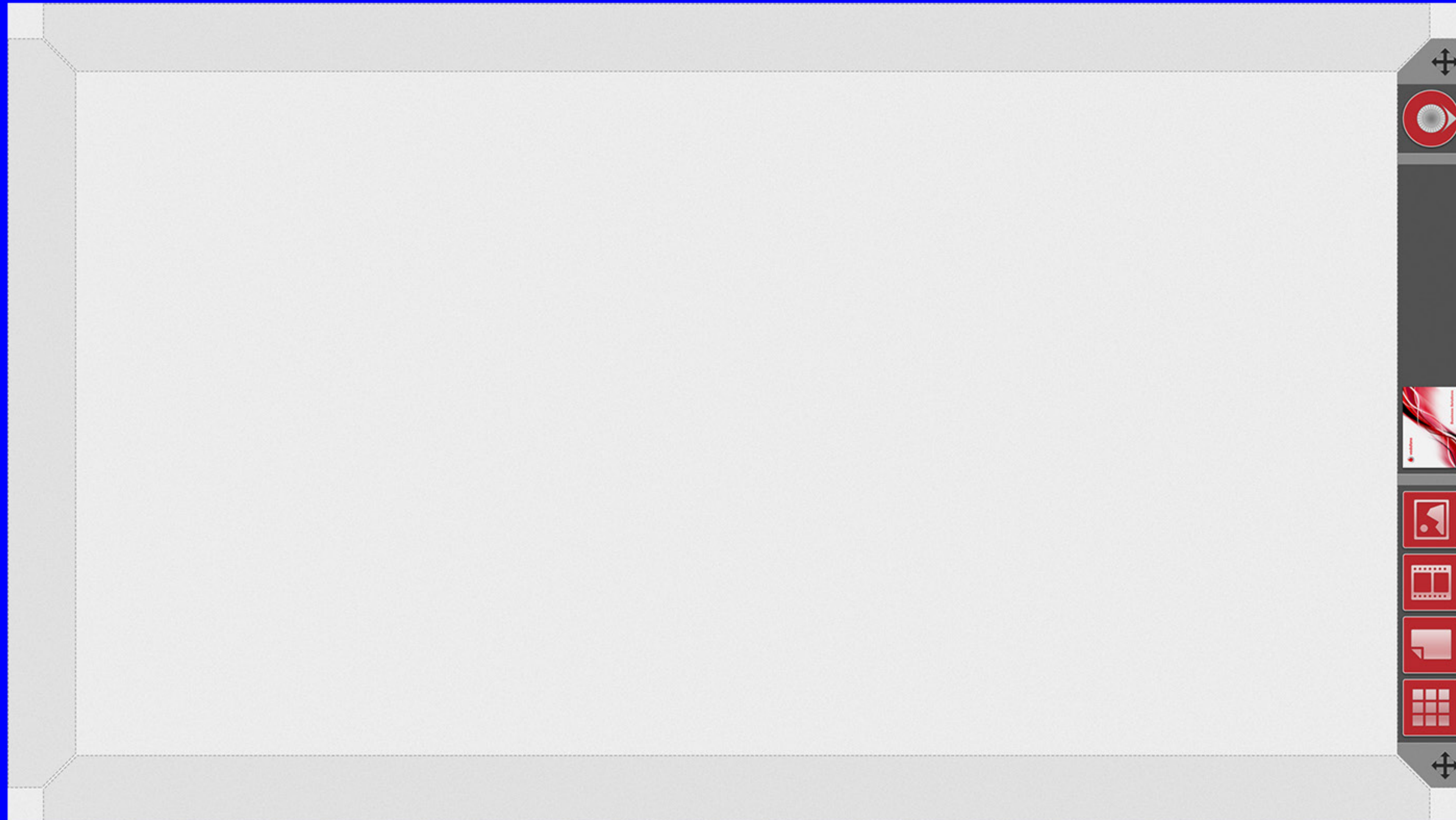
Documents can be easily dragged into the open space on the Dock, which becomes the Docked Documents Tray.



The Docked Documents Tray can hold an unlimited number of documents and can be navigated left/right like the Document Slider. The multi-directional Move Dock buttons on either end can be used to move/fling the Dock to another Dockable Area for an easy change of control.



Moving the Dock is super easy!



The arrow head on the circular Global Rotation button rotates all documents on the canvas 360 degrees on each document's center rotation point. This allows the presenter to ensure that users on all four sides of a table-top display can view multiple documents on the Canvas with ease.
